Step 1



• If advanced warning of adverse weather conditions is issued, complete gritting as soon as practically possible.

Areas that require gritting:

- Main routes of entry/exit.
- External fire escape routes and stairs.
- Delivery routes.
- · Smoking area.

Step 2



- As part of the pub opening procedures, check all external areas.
- If any access routes are blocked or slippery from snow/ice the area will need to be cleared and gritted.
- If the pub car park cannot be safely cleared and gritted, consider closing the car park until conditions improve.

Step 3



- Using a shovel, clear the main access areas and walkways of snow.
- Pile the excess snow in a location that will not obstruct any access area or fire exit.
- · Limit gritting/clearing to areas of immediate concern or risk.

Step 4



- Using a shovel, distribute the salt/grit over the ground ensuring even coverage is achieved.
- Display a hazard warning sign when gritting.

Step



- Visually inspect the areas at regular intervals throughout the day and complete additional gritting as required.
- If it rains, reapply grit as required.

Gritting in snow and ice

Step



- Do not wet mop any external steps or walkways if temperatures are below freezing.
- Do not use hot water to melt snow or ice.
- Switch off automatic plant watering systems in freezing conditions.
- Check external water taps are not dripping.
- A regular supply of grit/salt must be available throughout the period of adverse weather conditions. Inform the Duty Manager if supply of grit/salt is running low.
- Report any maintenance issues to the Duty Manager.
- All accidents, incidents and near misses must be reported to the Duty Manager immediately.

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
